Revisiting Infantile Sexuality Pauline Lee & Sarah Greaves

Dr Pauline Lee will present her paper highlighting the importance of infantile sexuality, in the context of her clinical work within a Parent-Infant Service.

Sarah Greaves shares her practice exploring objects and narratives, from creating a large-scale installation of transitioned objects about the psychological transition women make in becoming mothers; embroidering domestic objects with political texts and inner monologues, to looking at objects passed down through the Manchester Armenian diaspora and the stories they hold.

The development of sexuality begins in infancy, in the context of our primary relationships. This is however rarely discussed or thought about, even in services specifically supporting babies and their parents. The impact of this lack of consideration at such an early stage can be seen throughout our later development.

Dr Pauline Lee is a Consultant Clinical Psychologist and Psychoanalyst. She has worked for over 15 years in perinatal and parent-infant mental health in the NHS. She developed the Tameside and Glossop Early Attachment Service, based on a psychoanalytic model. This is now being replicated in 9 other boroughs across Greater Manchester, where Pauline is currently the Lead for Parent Infant Mental Health, and works in private practice.

Sarah Greaves is an award-winning visual artist and art psychotherapist. Greaves' artwork has been exhibited extensively across the UK. She has been awarded Arts Council funding, receiving international publicity, including two interviews on BBC Radio 4. Her work has been published in various international books and journals. As a qualified Art Psychotherapist Sarah works with new mothers, supporting women in their journeys into motherhood.

Jane Turner is a Psychoanalytic Child Psychotherapist. She currently works as a Parent-Infant Psychoanalytic Psychotherapist in the South West Yorkshire Trust Perinatal Mental Health Service.
